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Annual Homeowner's Meeting Summary

On Tuesday, September 17th, Rivershyre held its annual homeowner's association meeting as required by our by-laws. Unfortunately, only 24 out of approximately 275 homeowners were able to attend the meeting.

Our Board President, Randy Stone, called the meeting to order. He reviewed the "state of the community" and recapped our accomplishments over the past year and some of our goals for upcoming years.

Following Randy, each of the seven committee chairpersons was afforded the opportunity to share some thoughts on their recent activities and to solicit volunteers and support from the community. Mike Plankey, Chairperson of the Pool Committee gave an overall status of the pool's finances as well as their plans for the future.

Randy then presented information on a monetary reserve study that he has been working on. This was followed by the presentation of our 2003 budget which reflects **no increase** in our homeowner's dues for 2003.

Our Board Secretary, Bill Clark then solicited nominations for election to the 2003-2004 Board of Directors. Martha Kapfhammer, Ray Jasniecki, Denise McLain, and Bill Clark, all current Board members with expiring terms, agreed to serve again. They were joined by Becky Chaffin, Bill Ferguson, and Rick Claybon who volunteered to serve on the Board.

All seven were elected by unanimous voice vote of the homeowners.

They will join returning Board members Holly Bullock and Mike Paluba in January as the 2003 Board of Directors. Randy Stone will also serve one additional year as the Past President.

Following a question & answer session, the meeting was adjourned at 9:00pm.

We had several new volunteers for a few of our committees but we could definitely use more. The Finance Committee and the Neighborhood Watch Committee are in most need of assistance with the Grounds & Lake Committee and Architectural Control Committee looking for a couple additional members as well. 8th Annual Spooky to be Hungry Food Drive

It's that time of year! It's time for our annual all-volunteer food drive for the Golden Harvest Food Bank. On **Saturday, October 26** (also national "Make A Difference" Day), Rivershyre will participate with over six dozen other CSRA neighborhoods in what's grown into the area's largest food drive. We CAN make a difference!

neighborhoods, schools, and community groups and collected \$18,000 and 35,000 lbs. of food in the span of a few hours on a Saturday morning! All money collected goes directly to food purchases. Just \$10 can buy ~\$75 worth of food or enough for 40 meals!

Why should you get involved?

- The need is huge. The GHFB pantries served over 300,000 people in 2001 with 70% of those under age 18 or over age 60 (over 1.6 million meals total).
- It takes very little time. Spend a few hours on a Saturday morning and you're helping thousands of families.
- Volunteering is a great thing! It builds a sense of community, allows you to meet your neighbors, and demonstrates to your children the value of helping others. Get the whole family involved.
- It DOES make a difference. In 2001, the drive involved over 1000 volunteers in 80 CSRA

How can you get involved?

- Volunteer to collect food on October 26 from 9:30 am to 12:00 noon. We'll meet at 1181 Dartmore Court at 9:30 am for coffee/donuts and instructions. Bring the family! Wagons and strollers are also needed for carrying the collections.
- Donate generously! Non-perishable food, baby items such as diapers, and money are gladly accepted. If you will not be home during the collection, please leave your contribution in a grocery bag by your front door for pick up.
